Hola Mexico!

Project Summary

Children will explore the country of Mexico through its food, geography, music and history.

Essential Question

What are the key elements involved in creating an engaging and informative museum exhibition?

How are your children meeting the four components of effective projects?

Rigorous

How will students show in depth subject knowledge?

Promoting an understanding of Mexico and one of its famous ancient civilisations through challenge based sessions.

The children will compare the human and physical aspects of Mexico's geography with that of the UK, by learning map reading skills and finding out about extreme habitats.

They will learn how to research, compare historical resources and understand the difference between primary and secondary sources of information. The children will learn how to use ICT to present information in a number of different ways.

They will learn cooking skills and also how to compose and perform traditional Mexican music.

Engaging

How will students engage with the learning?

The children will immerse themselves in Mexican culture, through researching, planning and preparing a Mexican style celebration. Children will have first hand experience of trying Mexican food, listening to and performing Mexican music and dance. They will play traditional Mexican games.

Orienteering challenges will provide a real-world experience of map reading skills.

They will also have the ultimate aim of creating a museum exhibition and presenting this to their parents.

Authentic

What will our authentic audience be?

Parents and families will be invited to take part in our Mexican celebration.

Children will be set the challenge of curating a museum and Mexican interactive experience, which will be open to parents and families to view and participate in at the end of term.

Learning

How will students show their learning of key skills in this project?

Through purposeful weekly outcomes, addressing the key questions and working towards a museum style exhibition of their work.

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Project Overview

Year 5 and 6 will be taking a trek through Mexico, discovering what life is like for its citizens past and present.

They will find out about ancient Mexican civilisations, create artwork, music and food in the traditional style.

The children will become experts, brimming with knowledge, ready to create a museum exhibition and experience about Mexico, its people, culture and history, complete with artefacts, written information, interactive displays, and specific experts on different aspects.

Curriculum links and focus
