The whole school took part in an Assembly, delivered by the The Viking Link, to explain the project which supplies an exchange of wind energy between the UK and Denmark. The children learned all about how the electricity is shared through a cable under the ocean. The team complimented the quality of the children's own questions throughout, they asked some deep, thoughtful questions such as what frequency travels through the cable- which is 525,000 volts!





#### Silver Birch Viking Link Workshop

Silver Birch have learnt about the Viking Link and how the cables were created to ensure their survival under the North Sea. They have spent the morning building a rover to crawl along the seabed to plant the cable. The children worked on their team working skills to overcome problems and produce practical solutions to fix them!
