Dear Parents & Carers,


I wanted to highlight the importance of regular attendance at school. I appreciate that it has been difficult over the last few years due to the pandemic, but we now seem to have returned to some form of normality. As such, we do expect our pupils to attend school every possible day that they can. Missing a day from the school term can impact in many ways and we believe that it is only by attending school regularly and punctually that children and young people will be able to take full advantage of the educational opportunities available to them. High standards of attainment and achievement depend on good attendance.

The whole school community — students, parents and carers, teaching and support staff and school governors — have a responsibility for ensuring good school attendance and have important roles to play and we would ask for your support in this. Children are expected to attend school every day unless they are ill or must attend an appointment which cannot take place outside of school time. Leave of absence during term time will only be granted in exceptional circumstances and requests must be made, in advance, to the Head Teacher using the forms available from the office. Please do not take your children out of school unless it is absolutely necessary as disruptions to time in school mean your child misses vital learning opportunities. Sometimes it could be a vital part of the building blocks your child needs to access further learning.

We are striving for every child to have attendance of 95% and above over the school year and we do hope that we can all work together to achieve this.
