Curriculum Overview

English: Phonics, reading and spelling	Learning new sounds, spelling simple words and writing simple sentences. We are using Little Red Riding Hood by Lari Don to support our learning so that children can write our own stories.
Maths: Numbers to 10 Number bonds Addition within 10	Children will revisit and build upon key ideas taught in EYFS, exploring numbers to 10. They will count using one-to-one correspondence and use ten frames to represent numbers. They will then write numbers using both numerals and words. Children are introduced to the concept of 0 by counting backwards from numbers below 10. Children will compare numbers using the terms 'greater than', 'less than' and 'as many as'. They will explore which numbers are greatest and smallest in a series, and order numbers to show value.
 Design Technology: Structures: Windmills	Design, decorate and build a windmill for a mouse (client) to live in, develop an understanding of different types of windmill, how they work and their key features. Look at real existing examples and the functions that they carry out.
Science: Seasonal changes	 Children will identify how the weather changes across the four seasons, identify events and activities that take place in different seasons and learn about how trees change throughout the seasons. Children will also work scientifically to gather and record data about how seasons change over time.
 Music: Pulse & Rhythm (All About Me)	Through listening to a range of different music and playing games, children learn to identify the difference between the pulse and rhythm of a song and consolidate their understanding of these concepts through listening and performing activities.
Computing: Online Safety	Learning how to keep information safe and private online; who we should ask before sharing things online and how to give, or deny permission online.
Physical Education: Fitness	Children will develop their understanding of the benefits of exercise and a healthy lifestyle on their physical body, their mood and their overall health. They will work independently, in pairs and small groups to complete challenges in which they will sometimes need to persevere to
Religious Education: Understanding Christianity - God	Children will discover how Christians worship their God. Children will hear parables from the Bible and through these stories, children will learn that Christians believe God to be loving, kind, fair and forgiving.
PSHE: Family and Relationships	Children learn about what families and friendships are. We will also explore how to recognise how others show feelings and how to respond to them. Children will learn all about healthy friendships and how to make others feel welcome and included.
History: How am I making history?	We will develop an understanding of personal chronology, learn more about our own history and explore how we remember events. We will also find out what childhood was like for our parents and grandparents and compare childhood now with childhood in the past.
