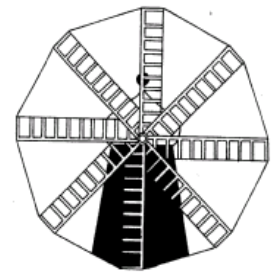


# Heckington St Andrew's Church of England Primary School Newsletter

## Head Lice.

We are currently experiencing an outbreak of head lice at school. Please take a minute to check your child's hair and if you spot any visitors you can either treat chemically (which requires **two doses** to kill lice and their eggs) or comb them out using conditioner and a fine toothed comb. To prevent the spread of head lice it is helpful if long hair is kept tied up.
